Psalm Notes

Psalm 24 has been associated with the triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem and with His ascension after His resurrection. Its "gates" have been understood as (1) the gates of Jerusalem, (2) the gates of heaven, and (3) the gates of our hearts, welcoming the King of glory (verses 7-10).

Though originally written to celebrate either David's conquest of Jerusalem (2 Samuel 5:6ff; 1 Chronicles 11:1-10) or the bringing of the Ark of the Covenant into Jerusalem (2 Samuel 6; 1; Chronicles 15-16), its ultimate point of reference is not David, but the Messiah.

Charles Spurgeon (1843-1892) outlined **Psalm 24** as follows:

1. **The true God** and His universal dominion (verses 1-2)
2. **The true Israel** and those who commune with the True God (verses 3-6)
3. **The true Redeemer** who opens heaven's gates for His people (verses 7-10)

Psalm 24

- 1 The earth and the riches with which it is stored,
The world and it dwellers,
belong to the LORD.
- 2 For He on the seas its foundation has laid,
And firm on the waters its pillars are stayed.
- 3 O who shall the mount of Je-ho-vah ascend?
Or who in the place of His holiness stand?
- 4 The man of pure heart and of hands without stain,
Who has not sworn falsely nor loved what is vain.
- 5 He shall from Je-ho-vah a blessing receive;
The God of salvation shall righteousness give.
- 6 Thus looking to Him is a whole bless-ed race,
All those who, like Jacob, are seeking Your face.
- 9 O gates, lift your heads!
Ageless doors lift them high!
The great King of glory to enter draws nigh!
- 10 This great King of glory,
O Who can He be?
Je-ho-vah of hosts,
King of glory is He!
