The Law of God

Which is the fourth commandment?

The fourth commandment is,

Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy.

Six days you shall labor, and do all your work,

But the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God

On it you shall not do any work.

Which day of the seven has God appointed to be the weekly Sabbath?

From the beginning of the world to the resurrection of Christ,

God appointed the seventh day of the week

to be the weekly Sabbath;

And for the first day of the week ever since,

to continue to the end of the world,

which is the Christian Sabbath.

What is required in the fourth commandment?

The fourth commandment requires the keeping holy to God such set times as He has appointed in His Word; expressly one whole day in seven, to be a holy Sabbath to Himself.

What is forbidden in the fourth commandment?

The fourth commandment forbids the omission, or careless performance of the duties required, and the profaning the day by idleness, or doing that which is in itself sinful, or by unnecessary thoughts, words, or works, about our worldly employments or recreations.

my defense the shield of faith,
and may my heart be more knit to Jesus. Amen.
