Psalm Notes

Psalm 103 is a song of pure praise that comes to us from the pen of King David himself. The most practical lesson of the psalm is the truth that the whole person—"all that is within me"—is to be engaged in the worship and praise of God (103:1). Our God deserves our whole-hearted worship.

Worship is a recalling of God's gracious acts on our behalf. Not only do we worship God with our whole being, we are to make it our purpose to celebrate all the blessings of God's goodness and "forget not all His benefits."

The great Redeemer (103:4, 6) has become like a Father to His people even though we are but dust (103:13-14).

He cares about our families. His faithful covenant love is even to children's children of those who keep covenant with Him (103:17-18).

His eternal throne is the seat of His rule and authority, the object of our hope, and the focus of our worship (103:19). Christ is there—so are our hearts. Christ is there—a just mercy has come to us.

The last stanza of the psalm (103:20-22) reflects the unique role of redeemed human beings in God's world. All His creatures reflect His glory, but His covenant people are able to magnify His mercy.

How to Become a Member

Christ's Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) is fulfilled in Christians who commit themselves to Christ and to one another in covenant relationship. Through **church membership** we acknowledge that Jesus Christ alone is the Head and Lord of the Church and we commit ourselves to do our part to build up the body of Christ for mission. Those who desire to be members are invited to fill out a **Membership Enrollment Form** and discuss membership with the pastor.

What About the Offering?

Giving is still part of our worship, but in order to minimize contact and to social distance during the pandemic, we are not passing the offering plate during the service. An offering plate is positioned at each entrance to the sanctuary.
