Psalm Notes

Psalm 133 is the fourteenth of the fifteen “Songs of Ascents” (songs sung by pilgrims on their journey to Jerusalem at festival time). This Psalm celebrates the rich fellowship enjoyed by like-minded pilgrim believers. With poetic artistry, the psalmist reminds us that harmony among believers is holy like the precious anointing oil that graced the head of Aaron and refreshing like the dew of Hermon upon the hills. In other words, harmony is necessary to our sanctified and united praise and encouragement in our shared journey of faith. We worship best when we love one another well.

The fourteenth “song of Ascents” is a prayer by the pilgrim for unity and refreshing fellowship among those worshiping at Zion.

Singing the psalms keeps before us the unity of the Bible and the oneness of the people of God. We **sing** this sweet song of God’s protection and peace **because its promises are ours in Christ**. We **sing** the Psalms because we cannot do better in praise or prayer than the words God Himself has given us in the psalms.
