
CareNet's Women of Life..... March 26 • 6:00PM

Psalm Notes

Matthew Henry, referring to the frequency with which **Psalm 100** was sung in the churches of his day said, “It is with good reason that many sing this Psalm very frequently in their religious assemblies for it is very proper both to express, and to excite pious and devout affections toward God.”

“‘Let us sing the Old Hundreth’ is one of the every-day expressions of the Christian church, and will be so while men exist whose hearts are loyal to the Great King,” added Charles Spurgeon.

Known by its Latin name *Jubilate Deo* (Latin for “Be Joyful in God”), Psalm 100 identifies where well-ordered worship begins:

Enter His gates with thanksgiving, And His courts with praise. Give thanks to Him; bless His name. (verse 5)

Singing the psalms keeps before us the unity of the Bible and the oneness of the people of God. We **sing** this sweet song of God’s protection and peace **because its promises are ours in Christ**. We **sing** the Psalms because we cannot do better in praise or prayer than the words God Himself has given us in the psalms.

How to Become a Member

Christ’s Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) is fulfilled in Christians who commit themselves to Christ and to one another in covenant relationship. Through **church membership** we acknowledge that Jesus Christ alone is the Head and Lord of the Church and we commit ourselves to do our part to build up the body of Christ for mission. Those who desire to be members are invited to fill out a **Membership Enrollment Form** and discuss membership with the pastor.

What About the Offering?

Giving is still part of our worship, but in order to minimize contact and to social distance during the pandemic, we are not passing the offering plate during the service. An offering plate is positioned at each entrance to the sanctuary.
